What is Pupil Premium?

Pupil Premium is funding provided by the Government for children who have been entitled to Free School Meals at any time in the last six years and for children who have been in local authority care at any time, even if they have since been adopted.

The school is advised of pupils entitled to Free School Meals or are currently in care but parents/carers of adopted pupils are asked to let us know, so that we can meet their particular needs.

Why is Pupil Premium given?

The aim of this additional funding is to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils and close the gap between them and their peers.

Working with Parents/Carers

Parkfields School will work with parents /carers to provide support when it is needed.

Attendance

Attendance of Pupil Premium children will be monitored by the school attendance officer. Poor attendance will be followed up with parents/carers.

PUPIL PREMIUM

What happens with Pupil Premium at Parkfields School?

At Parkfields we have used different approaches to raise the attainment of pupils who receive Pupil Premium funding.

Interventions can be used to support children with particular difficulties. Children are assessed, and monitored and specific intervention and support is put in place.

We have used funding for additional resources for Reading, Writing and Maths. These materials help individual pupils to focus on improvements in specific areas of the curriculum.



For Pupil Premium pupils Parkfields will:

- Set specific targets for children not making expected progress. Intervention is then put in place.
- Monitor attainment and progress regularly, in focused meetings led by the Deputy Headteacher.
- Identify any external support which may be needed and monitor the impact of such support.
- Monitor attendance.
- Provide pupils with appropriate careers advice.
- Provide an after school homework club with teacher support.

*The following support **may** then be provided over and above that which is normally provided to Parkfields 'pupils:*

- Booster tuition by experienced teachers .
- 1:1 curriculum support withdrawal sessions in the core subjects to boost attainment.
- Classroom Support additional to that identified on a Statement of Educational Needs.
- Cross-curricular intervention support .
- Support for home-based learning activities.
- Access to additional IT resources.
- Mentoring and support.
- Additional reward schemes.
- Breaktime and Lunchtime clubs for vulnerable children, providing access to an alternative provision during unstructured times.
- 1:1 pastoral support.
- Transition support.
