LO: To investigate three different places in England

This task continues from the last task about your local area and it will help you understand different parts of England in more detail.

Task 1: Define (find out the meaning) of these key geographical words:

Continent

Country

Region

Area

Hemisphere

County

Task 2: Where is England?

Use an atlas or the Internet to describe the location of England in the world. Use some of the words from the list above or from those in last week's task. Think about; which continent it is located in, which hemisphere it is in, which countries surround it, which seas surround it etc.

Task 3: Design a tour of England for a foreign visitor

Use the Internet or an atlas to find three or more places in England that a foreign visitor might want to see. Choose at least one place in the north, one in the middle and one in the south of England and preferably ones that you have never heard of or visited before so you can learn about it too. These can be actual towns or cities or areas such as The Lake District.

Include:

- The name of the area, region, town, city or village
- The region, area and/or county within which it is located (e.g., Bedfordshire, East Anglia, Northumberland)
- The type of settlement it is such as a city, town, village or even hamlet (this may not be applicable if you are choosing an area or region).
- A minimum of two pieces of further information about the place such as a famous church, an historical event that happened there such as Stamford Bridge where the Battle of Hastings took place, a famous tea room such as Betty's in Harrogate.

Your tour could be presented in any format. For example:

- A video
- A PowerPoint
- A leaflet (either digital or hand written and drawn)
